Game – The Time

Play and learn the time!

A. The teacher makes in advance a sheet with suggestions of different ways to set the time

Example ;(a sheet from the teacher) – full time and half hours and a.m. and p.m.

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8.00 a.m.	7.00 a.m.
3.30 p.m.	4.00 p.m.
8.30 p.m.	2.30 p.m.
12 noon	430 p.m.
11.00 a.m.	1.30 p.m.
10.15 a.m.	5.30 a.m.
5.30 p.m.	1.00 p.m.
7.30 p.m.	9.00 a.m.
12.30 p.m.	3.00 a.m.
6.30 p.m.	2.30 a.m.


Options for the students can be;

- digital time
- analogue time
- write the time with letters
- clocks showing the time
- clocks without hands
- set the time on the clock
- a.m and p.m time
- and a mix of all

There are many different times to choose from!

B. The students select 6 of the suggestions from the sheet, and write them in the squares they have made.

This will be their time board. Now they can play.



- 1. The teacher or a student cut up the sheet with all the suggestions, and put all the paper notes in a box.
- 2. He / she pulls one by one paper note read it.
- 3. The players look at the time on their board to see if they can make a match.
- 4. If they have, they mark it out.
- **5**. This continues until one player has completed their time board.
- **6.** Then the player shouts "Time out!" as they cover the last square on their time board.

The winner is the first player to mark out all of the time squares on their time board!
